FORCECOM REPORT

My FORCECOM report deals with the Awards Team. It looks like it's been a big mess for a long time.

We've gone through records and put in several hundred awards that were missing from the database, dating back to the beginning of the record, and also knocked out a few hundred certificates over the last few weeks, and there are still more. Every time I think we're caught up, there turn out to be several hundred more hiding behind the Christmas tree, like some unwanted gift. I have created a stop-gap system where everything is on one page (except for huge lists like the ISAs), and each time a task in completed, the task column is dated and initialed, so anyone can see where a award is at, who did what and when, and what still needs to be done - just did it on one page, instead of having to switch information among multiple pages, as the old system was doing.

Brian Allen was creating a new certificate template using the existing information and G&A design, which the 'Dant says we are to use until O1 JAN. Brian came up with a mock-up design for one certificate, and I need to get back with him to see how he's doing for the rest of the templates. We just create a template, simplify the text, make it so that only the name of the awardee goes in rather than the brigade and unit, and that should help turnaround time considerably.

I think the Awards Team probably needs to be redone, as well as the system, from the ground up... so I am going to take the three or four best candidates for the awards director and plug them in as the team, see if they can work together to knock out the remaining backlog, and thereby from there figure out who actually is best for the job. I just interviewed the last person today. I will be contacting the others shortly, to see if they're game for this as well.

Mike Malotte has been a big help to this process, doing much of the data entry and certificate creation, and sending out. If he wasn't already DCOTRACOM, I'd have asked him to take on this role, but I think TRACOM needs him just as much as we do - so I'm not going to steal him away.

I hope to have someone in place as DCO-Ops by end of this week, perhaps beginning of next. Only had two people put in for it, and I believe both of them can do the job.

DTS activity ticked upward a bit in October, with some chapter activity and two out of the three offices mostly active as well. One new vessel reservation request was received, for an established class. No class changes were processed. No new classes were added. No new shuttlecraft were reserved. On the departmental offices side, ASDB activity picked up quite a bit, with a contact from a group interested in using the Phoenix-class vessel (e.g., a StarFleet version of the SS Eleos from "Picard"). Since this is an established class, DTS Admin took over the approval process, but ASDB may work with the group to flesh out the tech data, since there is so little established on screen or behind the scenes. In addition, work continued on the Ouroboros-class fightercraft and planned Facebook page under development. OTI did not have any inquiries in September, but work progressed on the expansion of the Office's collection of vessel and station silhouettes for use in publications or for other graphical needs. Several new projects are also now in the conceptual stages. In OSA, other responsibilities have prevented CAPT Gerhard Pretorius from doing much more schematic work. We continue to search for additional persons to take postings in that office.

CAPT Scott Melrose reports that September was a bit of a busy month. He has continued to keep in touch with the Bureau staff through the group chat which he set up. He is also making sure that the official email server for the Bureau is set for any new design proposals. There have been some questions raised by the USS Blackstone on a possible ship-class change, but nothing definitive yet. (One question will be whether it will be to an existing class, or something new, which will determine whether this falls into ASDB's aegis or not. - AR)

Just recently, a new design proposal from BGEN Brian Pickett of Region 6 was received for a group that wants to set up a new chapter. He is requesting the new Phoenix-class, known as the "S.S. Eleos" from "Picard" Season 3. Not very much is known, specification-wise, about this class, but Scott will be assigning this proposal to my new staffer Commodore John Hardy, under his supervision. (It should be noted that this isn't a design review-and-approval project, since the design is established and canonical. ASDB, though, may be working to detail the ship on a tech level, since so little information actually exists about her from the show's creators, either in its civilian form in the early 25th Century or the older StarFleet version of the class. - AR]

Work continues on the Ouroboros-class fightercraft design proposal. Both BGEN Liam Smith and Scott are still working on the schematic art of the design, smoothing out details, and should be finalizing the design shortly.

Scott is also working on the Facebook SFI Advanced Starship Design Bureau page, and has informed both myself and ADM "Gumby" Simmons about this endeavor. [We look forward to seeing it!] One of the items for the new Facebook page is a new official logo that is presently being designed.

OTI:

In September, OTI did not receive any new inquiries. Meanwhile, though, work continues on the expansion of the Office's collection of starship silhouette graphics, for use in upcoming publications as needed. We are gradually closing in on the end of the classes in use by STARFLEET, and will then work on the best way to make the entire collection available for use. Several other projects are also in the concept stages, and when they are ready to move forward, we shall discuss in more detail.

OSA - Schematic Artist:

CAPT Gerhard Pretorius has remained busy, with little time for this office. He has supported DTS in other ways, though, through the Corps of Engineers. More on that in the next report. Meanwhile, we still continue to search for additional personnel to fill positions in this office, so the load is not entirely on Gerhard.

The Communique' was distributed on October 1. It contained more news submitted by chapters than we've had before, which is a very good thing. Mailchimp sent the CQ to 4,172 email addresses, with 100 bouncing. Trisha Tunis has submitted those bounces to Membership Services. She wonders if anyone is working on those since she has not seen a real reduction in that number from the 2 previous times the CQ was sent out. The CQ was opened by 2,278 recipients, or 55.9%. We do not have any numbers on how many members may have accessed the CQ via the website or database. The CQ Editor announced that members could submit original artwork for inclusion, but he had not received any by publication time. The photo contest for the next edition has the theme "Away Missions."

The CQ Editor, Justin Hunt, continued to work with the Accessibility Committee on an ESAC version of the CQ as well as a large print version. Work has halted though due to a current staffing situation with the committee. Justin hopes to have a zoom meeting with them before long to discuss a timeframe for continuing the work.

The Production team met twice in October to plan for the December 3rd broadcast, "The Holidays Show." Denise and Michael Okudo have accepted an invitation to be interviewed for the program. We invited chapters to record a short holiday greeting to send in for inclusion during the broadcast. We will have a number of other holiday themed spots as well. The auxiliary focus this time will be on the Intelligence division with an interview of its Director.

Social Media Services has submitted 2 positions to list with Volunteer Resources, Social Media Services Content Producer and Social Media Services Moderator. The SMS Director reached out to the Auxiliary Department to follow up on the promise from them to provide Discord moderator assistance. No one has been available yet. No negative feedback was received regarding the closure of the "*Communique*" Newsroom" group on Facebook. The group had become redundant. Notice of the impending closure was repeated several times over the course of 2 months.

The SFI Pinterest site audience was down for the month of October after it had a significant increase the previous 2 months. The monthly audience was 2.25K with 30% of the audience in the 18-24 age group, and 23.9% in the 25-34 age group.

SFMCA NEWS

From the STARFLEET Marine Corps Academy Superintendent:

The STARFLEET Marine Corps Academy currently comprises 5 colleges, covering 14 different Branches with over 160 available courses. October was a pretty solid month for the SFMCA. A total of 135 courses were taken, with Infantry, Aerospace, and Medicine – in that order – as the most popular Branches for the month. The most common score was in the Honors range (42%), followed closely by Pass (41%) with 17% of the students acing the exams. Over a dozen awards were earned, with the Initial Entry Training (IET) award leading the way.

We have a number of courses slated to make a return to the curriculum in the very near future. The Combined Arms and Military History schools are being revamped and reviewed for release. The Cadet program has been put on hold as the Academies look over the direction, they want these courses to go. One of the things our students may have noticed is a number of past Academic awards and devices being added to the database during October. It had come to our attention that some of these items hadn't been entered into the DB so Michael Timko, our Deputy Superintendent, did an audit over the past few years. After a lot of time and work, 123 Marines received a total of 269 awards and devices owed them. Going forward, the most common SFMCA awards (IET, Professional Development, and Marine Proficiency) are being entered into the database immediately upon entry of the course to help make sure that these items aren't missed. Shane Russell, COTRACOM, is responsible for the award certificates and send those out at the end of the month. If you think you are missing something on your transcript or don't have an earned certificate, please reach out to me at superintendent.sfmca@academy.sfi.org and we'll research it and get you what you're owed.

A reminder to all SFMCA students: we have reopened the SFMCA Degree Program. There are 4 degrees available – Combat Support, Marine Development, Marine Forces, and Marine Staff. Each degree has specific courses that need to be completed to earn the diploma. You'll find the course list on the Moodle home page of each college, and they are also listed on the specific Degree Application. Since the announcement in July, 12 degrees have been earned. If you're interested, send an email to *degree.sfmca@academy.sfi.org* with your name, your MSG, and your SCC # stating which degree you are seeking. The applicant will be sent a link to a form to fill out. Once the form is completed, email the above address to inform the Degree Director that the form is complete. Once all course completions are verified via the SFI database, your certificate of graduation will be sent. We hope to see you walking across the Academy stage in the near future!

As we head towards the end of 2023, we'll see a few more changes throughout the Schools. There are a number of -301 courses being reviewed and, quite often, those result in new courses for the Branch. Things are always changing here so visit often. If you ever have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask. I can be reached via email, Facebook, Messenger, and on Discord.

This month's report provides an overview of our current workflow and ongoing projects, including enhancing the registration process for the new database, improving server stability, and developing the SFI website. We also highlight new initiatives, such as Regional and Chapter websites, feedback-driven ideas for the new SFI website, and the transition to mailboxes. Additionally, we share updates on weekly team meetings, the development of an essential EC manual, and our progress with the Fleet Google Drive setup and collaborations with the Academy.

Current Workflow:

- Create an events calendar on SFI.org. This will allow chapters, regions, and departments to post about events they are hosting virtually that are open to all members.
- · Researching and resolve a few minor issues we have found with database functions no longer working
- Move to a dedicated server
- Create new emails for auxiliary staff
- Remove email forwards
- Build a new member database
- Build a new SFI.org website
- New SFI.org hosted Regional and Chapter websites
- Organize the Fleet Google Drive
- Create of a brand new EC manual
- Create badges for accomplishments and milestones on our current database
- Enter grades for split Vulcan Academy courses

Database

Focus has continued on the registration process. A new registration form was created with multiple enhancements to ensure better data integrity and a more streamlined experience for new members. The new form is broken into five sections, with each section being presented only after the required information for the previous section is provided. Two new optional fields have been added to the contact info, including a field of "AKA / Trek Name" and a field for the new member's preferred pronouns. The date of birth field is now a date picker, which will format to the local date format based on the location of the new member. Under address, the field for "state / province" is now tied to the country field, only presenting the relevant information based on the selected country. The phone number field, while not required, is also validated based on the selected country's format. Once a new member enters their contact and address information, they are presented with the Region and Chapter selection section, with the prospective member's geographic region being determined based on the entered address. Then the prospective member, through a series of prompts, has the ability to either choose a Chapter based on their geographic region, select a different Region to choose a Chapter from, or elect not to join any Chapter at this time. Next comes the option for a family membership, where through prompted guidance, the prospective member has the ability to enter information for up to 5 additional family members. After the selections for additional family members are complete, the member is given their yearly membership dues amount based on the number of family members they elected to include. Then the prospective member must verify that they have read and agree to the required notices. Only after that will the member be able to proceed to process their payment with Paypal. After their Paypal transaction is complete, the new member will be created in the database along with the included family members, and put in a pending state. As of this report, the form is complete and work has begun on creating the backend logic to actually create the new membership. Following this will be the ability to approve the membership, moving it from a pending state to active and assigning all new member's an SCC number. For anyone interested in scheduling a demo of the work that has been completed, please reach out to your Regional Coordinator to have one set up.

SFI Servers

We have experienced intermittent server downtime, typically during peak usage times for other companies and organizations sharing our server space. To improve stability and independence, we are exploring the possibility of migrating to a dedicated server.

Infoserv is evaluating different database processes to establish a new database system. We are currently focusing on assessing the functions of Ops, which is expected to take at least another month.

New! Regional websites and chapter websites

In January, all Regions will be eligible for a free website on SFI.org. To qualify, each Region must designate a webmaster to build and manage their website using the SFI WordPress multi-site platform.

Also starting in January, SFI will offer two cost-effective web hosting packages for chapters:

- Option 1: Host your existing website with your unique domain on our servers.
- Option 2: Host your website on our multi-site platform, [yourchaptername].SFI.org. This option includes access to our wide range of plugins and the security of our SSL certificate.

Current SFI Website

We informed the ECAB in September of the process for submitting content for inclusion in the SFI website's announcement section. Regrettably, we have not received any submissions from RC or EC members in the past month. We encourage members who are interested in sharing important announcements to contact their respective RCs.

We are actively working to reintroduce an events calendar to showcase virtual events open to all SFI members. If you have a special or recurring event open to all members, please don't hesitate to contact Greg Mortensen at <u>gmortensen_infoserv@sfi.org</u>.

New SFI Website

We launched a feedback form last month for members to share their suggestions and opinions on the new SFI website. We appreciate the valuable feedback we've received, and the survey is still open.

SFI Email and Vanity Email Jobs

We continue to receive requests for help with troubleshooting existing email accounts and setting up new ones. To streamline our support process, we are transitioning from forwarders to mailboxes.

Academy Grades

We are presently collaborating with the academy to incorporate historical grades for students who have previously completed courses that have since been divided into smaller segments.

New InfoServ/DPO manual

We have realigned the content originally intended for an infoserv document to be integrated into a vital EC manual. This project is spearheaded by Gregg Kleiner and receives support from Meg Karper and Ann Marie Norris. We are also consulting with the Academy and Jim Landelius, so this can have long term benefits for the SOLC college.

Fleet Google Drive

Fleet Google Drive setup has recommenced following a brief pause. This platform will serve as a permanent repository for all fleet documents, addressing historical challenges related to document loss due to staff turnover. Additionally, it will include Google Meet, obviating the necessity for the fleet to maintain its Zoom accounts.

Weekly Team Meetings

Our team holds weekly meetings with two sessions to accommodate our diverse time zones. These meetings are essential for sharing updates, addressing current issues and challenges, and planning future work. To foster collaboration and seamless coordination, we have invited Membership Services to join any of our meetings, and any other EC departments are welcome to attend.



Looking at the past twelve consecutive months of financial activity (October 1st, 2022 thru October 30th, 2023), STARFLEET's balance sheet started with \$140,655 and has trended down slightly, ending this rolling one-year period with a net balance of \$138,288, which represents a net loss of -\$2,367 (-1.73%). During this rolling annual period, more operating expenses were going out than income coming in during four of the twelve months during this period (October 2022, November 2022, March 2023, & July 2023).
